

Jack-o'-lanterns, or simply Halloween pumpkin, emerged from the Irish folkloric tradition of using small lanterns made within turnips and potatoes to ward off wandering spirits.

The name pumpkin originated from the Greek word Pepon, which means large melon. It was then nasalized by the French into "pompo", which the English changed "pompon" to "Pumpion," and so on until American settlers arrived at the word we use today.

Scientists believe that pumpkins originated in North America about 9000 years ago. The oldest pumpkin seeds have been found in Mexico and date back to somewhere between 7000-5550 B.C. Pumpkins (along with other forms of squash) were a historically important food staple among Native Americans.
