


This graph shows attendance rates by subgroup.

Community Service:

Par Excellence Academy was happy to host Children's Defense Fund's Freedom School in the summer 2019.

From the CDF's website (www.childrensdefense.org):

Rooted in the Mississippi Freedom Summer project of 1964, the *CDF Freedom Schools* program is a six-week summer literacy and cultural enrichment program designed to serve children and youth in grades K–12 in communities where quality academic enrichment programming is limited, too expensive, or non-existent. By partnering with schools, faith and community-based organizations, municipalities, colleges and universities, and juvenile detention facilities, we are able to offer this program in these communities at no-cost.

Community Partners:

We have continued to maintain and enhance very strong collaborative partnerships with several organizations throughout the community such as Park National Bank, Licking Memorial Health Systems, Owens Corning Fiberglas, Blackfire Engineering, Ltd., State Farm, Kicks Mix, Shiloh Baptist Church, Usborne Books and More, Licking County Library, Downtown Association, Schlauchs Serpents, Service Committees, Campus Commitment Volunteers with COTC/OSU; Foster Grandparents, AmeriCorps mentors and volunteer support in building beautification and garden mentors.

Ohio Revised Code (ORC) 3314.03 (D)(2) specifies that the sponsor of the school must "monitor and evaluate the academic and fiscal performance and the organization and operation of the community school on at least an annual basis."

In its evaluation of the school performance, the Ohio Department of Education Office of School Sponsorship assesses the performance of Par Excellence Academy on each of the required Ohio School Report Card indicators and on performance measures listed in the charter contract.

The Ohio Department of Education Ohio of School Sponsorship monitors the performance of the community schools through our attendance at Par Excellence Academy board meetings, visits to the school, monthly review of financial reports and reviews of academic progress reports along with other reports related to the school's performance.

The Ohio Department of Education Office of School Sponsorship currently sponsors Par Excellence Academy. Par Excellence Academy was generally compliant with the laws, rules, and regulations governing Ohio community schools and we continue to monitor compliance with laws, rules, and regulations throughout the school year. Academically, Par Excellence Academy is progressing towards compliance in academics and we will continue to provide technical assistance and monitoring of school academics.

The Annual Report for Par Excellence Academy related to the performance of the school and all other schools sponsored by the Ohio Department of Education will be posted on www.education.ohio.gov, no later than November 30, 2020.

All Sponsors of community schools in Ohio are required to submit a written report of the evaluation results of the school's academic, financial, organization performance, and the school's legal compliance to the Ohio Department of Education and make the report available to parents of students enrolled in the community school.
